Use these templates to help you create a Works Cited page. Transfer to your Works Cited page exactly as you have filled this page out. Use italics, quotes, and punctuation exactly as indicated. Remember, for **each entry** you need to keep the first line at the margin and then indent all lines of the entry after that. Keep your entries single spaced, but skip lines between each one. Alphabetize your entries. **<u>Easybib.com</u>** is a great resource to help you find templates for other types of materials. **<u>Easybib.com</u>** will even do the citations for you!!

Special Science Fair Project notes:

- You must have 3 references for your project. These can include encyclopedias, books, interviews, magazines, newspapers, pamphlets, electronic resources, etc.
- You may NOT NOT NOT use more than two encyclopedias unless you have five or more references. Any student wishing to compete at the science fair is recommended to have at least five references.
